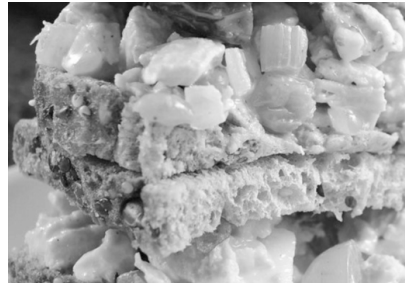


More Recipes

Fruity Curry Chicken Salad



Ingredients

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves - cooked and diced
 1 stalk celery, diced
 4 green onions, chopped
 1 Golden Delicious apple - peeled, cored and diced
 1/3 cup golden raisins
 1/3 cup seedless green grapes, halved
 1/2 cup chopped toasted pecans
 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper
 1/2 teaspoon curry powder
 3/4 cup light mayonnaise

Directions

Prep: 45 m
 Ready In 45 m
 In a large bowl combine the chicken, celery, onion, apple, raisins, grapes, pecans, pepper, curry powder and mayonnaise. Mix all together. Serve!•

Grilled Chicken Salad with Seasonal Fruit

Ingredients

1 pound skinless, boneless chicken breast halves
 1/2 cup pecans
 1/3 cup red wine vinegar
 1/2 cup white sugar
 1 cup vegetable oil
 1/2 onion, minced
 1 teaspoon ground mustard
 1 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon ground white pepper
 2 heads Bibb lettuce - rinsed, dried and torn
 1 cup sliced fresh strawberries

Preheat the grill for high heat. Lightly oil the grill grate. Grill chicken 8 minutes on each side, or until juices run clear. Remove from heat, cool, and slice. Meanwhile, place pecans in a dry skillet over medium-high heat. Cook pecans until fragrant, stirring frequently, about 8 minutes. Remove from heat, and set aside. In a blender, combine the red wine vinegar, sugar, vegetable oil, onion, mustard, salt, and pepper. Process until smooth. Arrange lettuce on serving plates. Top with grilled chicken slices, strawberries, and pecans. Drizzle with the dressing to serve.•

After nearly 71 years calling Fort Wayne and Achduth Vesholom home, Leonard and Rikki Goldstein are preparing to move later this month to Carmel. **Please join us for Shabbat on Friday, September 9 at 7 p.m. at the Temple when we offer our best wishes and gratitude for their involvement, generosity, and commitment to tikkun olam (repairing the world).**

Rabbi Lenny Sarko will offer a special blessing for the Goldsteins during the service, followed by an Oneg Shabbat in honor of Len and Rikki hosted by the Temple Board and congregation.

We'll also have an opportunity to congratulate Len on being named to the 2016 Hoosier Jewish Legends – A Hall of Fame, which was inaugurated this year by the Indiana Jewish Historical Society as part of the Indiana Bicentennial. Len will be among the legends recognized at the IJHS annual meeting on Sunday, October 23 in Indianapolis for making “a significant and lasting impact to their profession, community, and the fabric of our cultural heritage in Indiana.”

When Len and Rikki moved to Fort Wayne as newlyweds in 1945, they quickly became active participants at the Temple and in the Jewish and greater community. Len currently serves on the Temple's Board of Directors as co-chair of the Social Action and Planned Giving committees and is a past recipient of the William Brosler Award for Outstanding Volunteerism. Rikki served last year on the Rabbinic Search Committee.
