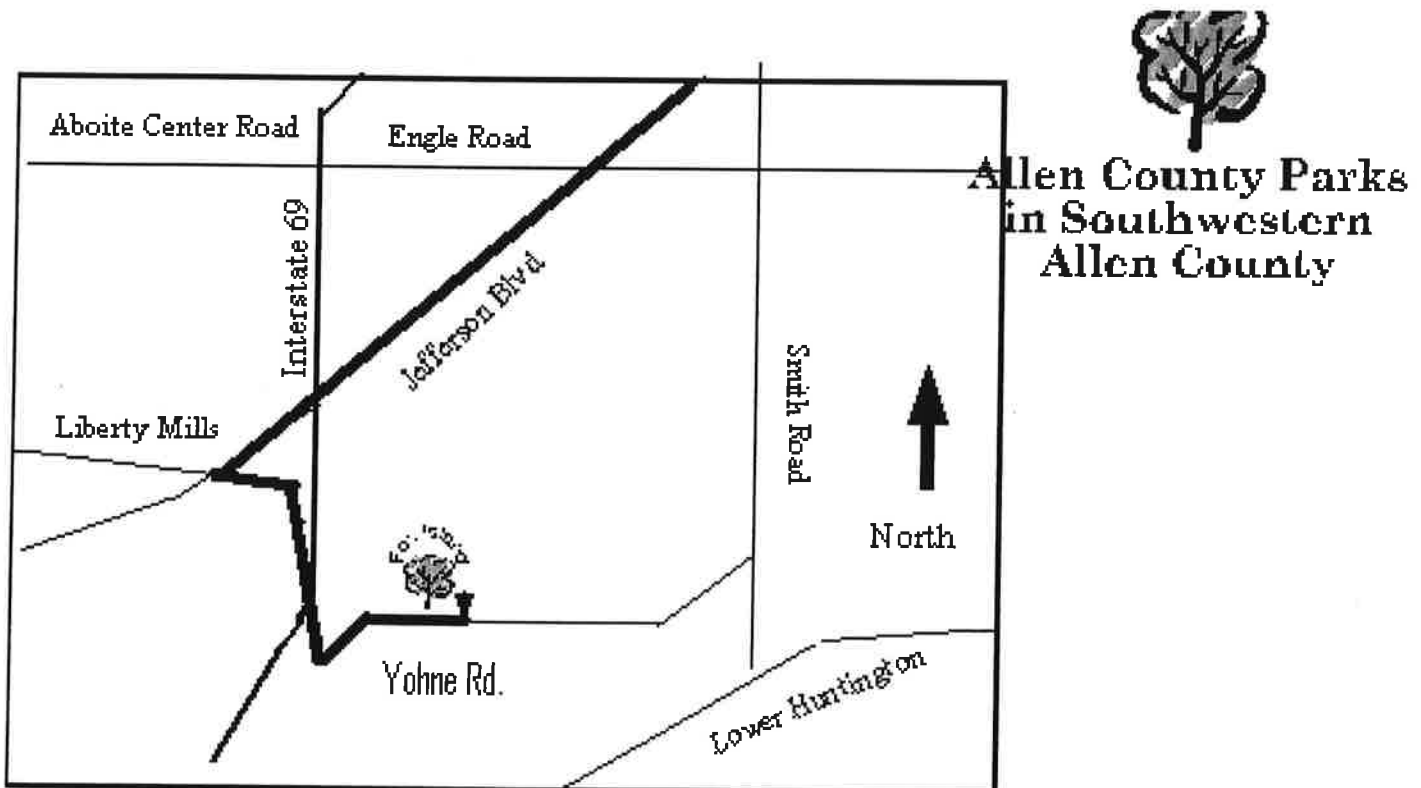

## Getting to Fox Island:

- **From SW Allen County:** Jefferson Road/U.S. 24 turn onto Yohne Road. Fox Island is ~ 1 mile on the left hand side of the road. Enter the park. Drive a short distance to the stop sign. Go straight. This will take you to the Bird Observation Building where you will drop off your child/ren.
- **From NW Allen County:** I-69 to exit 102. As you exit, get into the right hand turn lane. Turn right on Jefferson Blvd./U.S. 24. At the second light, turn left onto Yohne Road. Fox Island is ~ 1 mile on the left hand side of the road. Enter the park. Drive a short distance to the stop sign. Go straight. This will take you to the Bird Observation Building where you will drop off your child/ren.
- **From NE Allen County or within city limits:** You will want to take a main road to Jefferson Blvd. Clinton or Ardmore Extended/Hilligas to Jefferson is best. Turn west on Jefferson. At the west edge of town, Jefferson and I-69 intersect. Continue west two more lights. Turn left on Yohne Road. Fox Island is ~ 1 mile on the left hand side of the road. Enter the park. Drive a short distance to the stop sign. Go straight. This will take you to the Bird Observation Building where you will drop off your child/ren.

# Behavior & Consequences

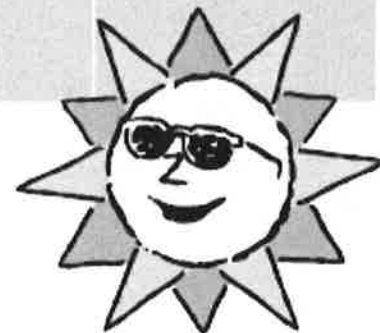
## Camper

I understand that following the Fort Wayne Jewish Federation Code of Honor helps everyone enjoy camp and that there will be consequences when I choose not to follow it.

## Parent

At camp, we strive to teach children how to be good "community members." Occasionally, however, campers will act inappropriately, sometimes engaging in unsafe or aggressive behaviors. The following behaviors will result in the consequences enforced.
