FILM & DISCUSSION ON "TWO WHO DARED"

Join us on Sunday, April 19, when we screen the film "Two Who Dared," the story of Waitstill Sharp, a Unitarian minister, and his wife, Martha, who rescued Jewish children from the Holocaust. The film begins at 2 p.m. at the Allen County Public Library Downtown, followed by a reception and a discussion. The fascinating afternoon is hosted by the Temple in partnership with the Jewish Federation of Fort Wayne and the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Fort Wayne with support from the Dr. Harry W. Salon Foundation.

The discussion will be led by the Rev. Misty-Dawn Shelley, Rabbi Cattapan, and Peter Braunfeld, who is the guest speaker for the Federation's community Yom Hashoah service and program the next evening at 7 p.m. at the Rifkin Campus at 5200.
