EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

We send our condolences to the families of those who lost their lives at the Israel/Gaza border this week. Our prayer is that people of good will from both sides of the border will come together and work for real peace through a two-state solution.

On Monday, May 14th, Israelis celebrated the 70th anniversary of independence with the opening of the new United States Embassy in Jerusalem. The United States and Israel have enjoyed a longstanding bipartisan friendship centered on the shared values of peace, democracy, freedom and progress. As the Bible notes, Israel's historic ties to Jerusalem date back over 3,000 years. Jerusalem has been Israel's capital and the seat of government since the country was established in 1949. All of Jerusalem was reunited in 1967 and is today a vibrant cultural and spiritual center that celebrates its diversity and welcomes visitors of all faiths from around the globe. Since reunification and for the first time in history, Muslims, Christians, and Jews are free to worship in Jerusalem at their holy sites. There are over 33 mosques, 50 churches and 100 synagogues operating freely in Jerusalem. In fact, Israel is the only place in the Middle East where Christianity is growing.

When Israel unilaterally withdrew from Gaza in August of 2005, there was no siege on Gaza and there was no blockade. However, after the Israeli withdrawal, two of the terrorist organizations, Hamas and Islamic Jihad, began the conflict which is evident today; perpetual conflict in an attempt to achieve the destruction of Israel was more important than the peace and welfare of their people. Millions upon millions of international aid dollars for Gaza development have been diverted to build terror attack tunnels into Israel, for the sole purpose of kidnapping and murdering Israelis.

Hamas's charter calls for DEATH TO JEWS and the total destruction of Israel. In an attempt to achieve this end, Hamas with the financial, PR and weapon support of Iran and others, has purposely turned Gaza into a war zone. There is genuine suffering and poverty among its citizens. Hamas, as you read this, is offering to the families in Gaza \$100 if they take part in the protest and \$1000 if they kill an Israeli.

As a sovereign nation, Israel has the right and the obligation to defend its citizens and its borders. When visiting Israel in 2008 as a U.S. Senator, former president Obama went to the Israeli border town of Sderot, which has been targeted by thousands of rockets, and commented, "the first job of any nation state is to protect its citizens... If somebody was sending rockets into my house where my two daughters sleep at night, I'm going to do everything in my power to stop that. And I would expect Israelis to do the same thing".

Twice, Israel has offered the Palestinians a two-state solution the equivalent of all the West Bank and Gaza, and parts of Jerusalem for their capital, but each time has been turned down. Israel is and will remain an independent sovereign nation, despite attempts by all those who demonize it and want it destroyed. Once this fact is acknowledged, further compromise can be made and accepted. The Jewish Federations of North America strongly supports a two-state solution for Israelis and Palestinians. The peoples of both Palestine and Israel deserve the opportunity to live side by side, safe and secure in states of their own.

They and their children's children deserve no less....



JFNA's History and Predecessors: JFNA is the legal successor of United Jewish Appeal, Inc. ("UJA") and The Council of Jewish Federations, Inc. ("CJF"). In November 1999, UJA and CJF merged into UJA, and UJA thereupon changed its name to United Jewish Communities, Inc. ("UJC"). In November 2009, UJC changed its name to The Jewish Federations of North America, Inc ("JFNA").

UJA was venerated for decades for its lifesaving mission and achievements. UJA was founded on January 10, 1939, when the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee ("JDC"), the United Palestine Appeal ("UPA," later to become the United Israel Appeal, "UIA"), and the National Coordinating Committee for Aid to Refugees (later, NYANA, the New York Association for New Americans), merged fundraising campaigns to create a "United Jewish Appeal" in order to provide relief to distressed European Jewish communities. Donated funds helped to save Jewish lives during the war years and fed survivors in the Displaced Persons camps after the Holocaust.



From the declaration of the Jewish State of Israel in 1948, UJA was committed to the welfare of the people of Israel and the ingathering of Jews from the Diaspora. Through the programs of its beneficiary agencies – JDC and The Jewish Agency for Israel – UJA fed, clothed, and provided sustenance and hope for people in Jewish communities from Latin America to Europe, North Africa to the former Soviet Union.

UJA's lifesaving mission to world Jewry and the people of Israel, and its proud, legendary history, were continued by the UJC and remain the firm commitment of JFNA. UJA's former offices were located at 1290 Avenue of the Americas, NY, NY and 99 Park Avenue, NY, NY.

CJF served as an umbrella organization of American and Canadian Jewish Federations, fostering communication between them about common interests and problems, and strengthening their combined impact on global needs. The Federations today are part of JFNA, which carries on the mission of CJF. CJF was located at 730 Broadway, NY, NY.



JFNA's Pledge in a time of Crisis:

We provide a lifeline for Jews and non-Jews in distress, at home, in Israel and across the globe. Whether it's missiles raining down on Israel's south, a violent conflict in Ukraine, Hurricane Sandy on the East Coast or an earthquake in Nepal, Federation is there to help – and to rebuild.

How JFNA helps:

Our network of local and international partners enables us to respond quickly and effectively. We fund urgently needed basics like food and medicine, and long-term needs like trauma counseling. We provide resources to emergency service providers so they can help where they're most needed.

We also enable trained staff to expand their support of the most vulnerable populations, whose needs escalate during emergencies.

JFNA's Impact:

Federations raised \$55 million during Operation Protective Edge in 2014, and used it to provide trauma support for Israel's most vulnerable citizens, aid lone soldiers, offer respite to people living in the conflict zones, and help Israel's economy recover.

In Ukraine, where the lives of more than 30,000 elderly Jews and 4,600 children have been disrupted by conflict, we're delivering food and medicine, sheltering displaced people, and expediting aliyah for those who want to move to Israel.

Immediately after the earthquake in Nepal, we helped bring an expert disaster response team to provide immediate relief and assess ongoing needs.

For decades we've ensured humanitarian relief for those who've needed it most. Federation holds out a safety net. And we'll never let it fall.

At the celebration we screened a video of 8 Midwest Governors giving Israel their best wishes.





Viewpoint: Israel at 70 and the power of hope

This month, as Israel celebrates the 70th anniversary of its founding, I asked myself: What is the secret of its extraordinary success in the face of tremendous difficulties that have included six major wars and countless acts of terrorism? Israel's story provides an inspiring example of the power of hope.

In 1973, I was a student on overseas study at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. On Oct. 6, 1973, the combined forces of Egypt and Syria launched a surprise attack that threatened the survival of the country. Israel survived the war, but at a huge cost. And the situation did not improve.




Proposed Bylaw Change:


