

Merkaz Ma'ase

A leadership program for young adults in Israel. <u>Merkaz Ma'ase</u> engages young people in a year of volunteer service after they have graduated high school and before they begin their army service.

Founded in 2004, Ma'ase Center Association engages hundreds of young adults and thousands of teenagers, all from Israel's socio-geographic periphery, in volunteering and leadership programs. Ma'ase's work is based on international studies that show

volunteering to be an effective tool for enhancing socio-economic mobility, promoting equal opportunity and creating a shared civil society.

Working with you. For us all. Simply put, <u>Jewish Federation of Fort Wayne</u> is our community's center for Jewish philanthropy. Thanks to your generosity, initiatives such as the Annual Campaign fund much-needed programs and services that touch countless lives in our community.



A pre-army volunteer-year and community Nachal program.
Named after Lieutenant General Refael Eitan, the program is aimed at motivated, committed young adults who wish to make social and personal change.



Ma'ase in the Negev

Our second six-month pre-army preparatory program (Ma'ase in the Galilee's younger sibling) is aimed at high school graduates who are enlisting in March or who wish to defer their enlistment until March.



The Gal Leadership Academy

The Gal Academy is aimed at high school graduates interested in becoming leaders within society. The Academy was set up in partnership with Achari and is based in AKKO with branches in Haifa and Kiryat Bialik.



Ne'urim

The Ne'urim program develops and promotes leadership, volunteering, excellence and equal opportunity within the Druze society, through youth centers. The program provides young people ages 13-25 from varying social backgrounds with a variety of quality activities that focus on promoting volunteering, leadership development, education enrichment and excellence.



The Academy for Bedouin Leadership in the Galilee

A pre-army six-month program for Bedouin high school graduates who are enlisting in the army in March. The program is open to young Bedouin men from the Galilee. It is a residential program in Givat Haviva.



The Achva Program

The aim of the program is to create a new generation of young leaders, who pursue higher education in desirable fields and integrate into the Israeli society. The program provides young women from the socio-geographic periphery, many of them from the Ethiopian community, with the opportunity to participate in a transformative volunteer year via national civil service, while also enabling them to improve their academic skills. Participants receive personal mentoring in various tracks.

Duroob (Ways, in Arabic)

We believe that helping young Arab adults to volunteer in a professional manner according to the needs of their community will promote the development of human and community resources and help to advance social change in the Arab society as a whole.

PEOPLE OF THE BOOK

Author Chris Bohjalian was the 40th speaker for the People of the Book program hosted by the Jewish Federation of Fort Wayne. He spoke to a near-capacity crowd on Monday evening April 29th at the Rifkin Campus. Chris Bohjalian is the bestselling author of over 20 books, several screenplays and two recent plays. A critically acclaimed novelist, he uses his gripping fiction to explore social issues and how they play out in the lives of ordinary people, as well as to shed light on some of the most important moments in history. The topic for his talk in Fort Wayne was "The Young Turks to the Young Nazis: The Genocides that Scar us Still." Enhancing his talk with the use of slides and videos, he made the point of explaining how the Armenian Genocide, which occurred during the time period of World War I, had a profound influence on the Nazis a generation later. Over 1.5 million Armenian Christians were brutally slaughtered by the Turks and over 6 million Jews were killed by the Nazis of Germany. These two horrific tragedies of the 20th Century were caused by evil men desiring to wipe out religious minorities.

Mr. Bohjalian concluded his speech with a question and answer session and a book signing. He received a standing ovation for his very informative talk.

The People of the Book program is extremely grateful for the generosity of the Dr. Louis A. and Anne B. Schneider Foundation which supports this event. This wonderful funding allows the program to be offered at no cost to attend. A free will offering was collected, however, to support the upcoming Violins of Hope project and the participation of the Fort Wayne Youth Philharmonic in concert next November.

The Jewish Federation of Fort Wayne is very appreciative of the members of the People of the Book Committee for their valuable time and effort in making this outstanding event possible.

The summer of 2019 is officially the "Summer of Synagogues" for the IJHS! Follow us on Facebook at @illndianaJHS as we embark on a road trip to document Indiana's synagogues. We will be making many stops across the State including Marion, Muncie, Kokomo, Ligonier, Goshen, Elkhart, and of course Fort Wayne! This grant-funded project will document all of the synagogues, originally built to be synagogues, in Indiana with photographs and floor plans on a digital, interactive map online. While the focus is on the buildings which are still standing, those which have been demolished will also be included using archival photos whenever possible.


